WWHA Roundup Auctions

One of WWHA's long-standing traditions are the silent and live auctions. Bidding for items in the silent auction take place Thursday morning through Saturday at noon. Items in the live auction receive only 'live' bids and are sold to the highest bidder during the Saturday night "Boots & Spurs" banquet.

For the auctions to be a success, WWHA depends on donations of items by the membership and the vendors. Items valued under \$100 are placed in the silent auction while those valued at \$100 and more are in the live auction.
