

WHERE ARE THE FRANK WATERS - ALLIE EARP INTERVIEW NOTES?

From 1935 to 1936, author Frank Waters conducted a number of interviews with Alvira "Allie" Earp, wife of Virgil Earp, for a book that was to tell the story of the Earps and Tombstone from Allie's perspective. The resulting manuscript was rejected by more than one publisher in 1937 and 1938 but was eventually published, in a revised form, in 1960 under the title *The Earp Brothers of Tombstone: The Story of Mrs. Virgil Earp*.

According to William Shillingberg, in his introduction to a 2004 auction catalog of the "Collections of John D. Gilchriese," Frank Waters gave Gilchriese, a close friend and Earp biographer, "all the original notes of his interviews with Virgil's widow." Those original notes were not part of the 2004 auction, but it's known that Gilchriese made several private sales toward the end of his life, some of which included unpublished manuscript materials.

An online search fails to turn up the Waters-Earp interview notes in a public institution. If any WWHA member knows of the whereabouts of these notes and is willing to pass along that information, please contact Mark Lee Gardner at wahtoyah@yahoo.com. Gardner, whose latest book is The Earth Is All That Lasts: Crazy Horse, Sitting Bull, and the Last Stand of the Great Sioux Nation, is currently working on a book that focuses on the relationship between Wyatt Earp and Doc Holliday.
