2023 Roundup Report

In July of 2023, the Wild West History Association met for its fourteenth annual Roundup in San Antonio, Texas. We were here to celebrate the 200th anniversary of the founding of the Texas Rangers. The Roundup was held in the historic Menger Hotel. The Menger is conveniently located directly between the Alamo and the San Antonio River Walk. From the Menger, you could go to just about any museums, attractions, or any other major landmarks in downtown San Antonio. For instance, the renowned Council House Fight between the Texas Rangers and the Comanches took place well within walking distance of the Menger. My family and I arrived at the historic hotel on Tuesday, the day before the Roundup began.

On Tuesday evening, there was a cocktail party for our board members and speakers. After that event, we took a scenic walk through San Antonio at night, where we saw the site of the aforementioned Council House fight, walked through the famous river walk, and got a nice view of the Alamo. After a day of travel, we enjoyed taking an evening walk. The next day, the board of directors had a meeting, so my father and I had some free time. A few hours from where we stayed, there was a privately-owned ranch in which there was a plethora of World War Two, Cold War, and modern military weapons and vehicles, nearly all of which were completely operational. At the ranch, you are given the opportunity to fire guns and artillery, as well as being allowed to drive and fire tanks from all over the world. Even if you're unable to drive or fire one, you can still enjoy the freedom of getting inside them at the military museum on-site. After a fun afternoon, we came back to San Antonio to take part in the welcoming reception at the Buckhorn Saloon.


The Buckhorn, on top of having great food, has a Texas Ranger Museum and their own separate Buckhorn Museum. The former has many artifacts from the early days to modernity of the Texas Ranger Organization. The Buckhorn Museum, on the other hand, contains an eclectic mix of Texas history, illusionary demonstrations, and other assorted exhibits. Thursday started with a greeting by an active Texas Ranger, who gave a thorough presentation on the modern duties of the Ranger organization. After that, my father kicked off a day of presentations by authors and historians with a view into the life of my 5 greats grandfather, who was a Ranger and a signer of the Texas Declaration of Independence. In the middle of the day, we had our annual WWHA awards luncheon provided by the Menger. During the luncheon, people could visit the vendors and view the items going into our silent and live auctions.

On Friday, we started off with a half day of lectures and presentations, followed by a lunch and afternoon on our own to explore the San Antonio area and visit its most impressive attractions. For those who were interested, a tour guide was provided to lead a tour through the Menger Hotel and speak about its history and notable guests. In the evening, we re-assembled and had our yearly program, "An Evening With," which focused on Australian author Peter Brand, one of the foremost authorities on the intriguing personalities from 1880s Tombstone.

Our last day began with a memorial of those we lost in the past year in a ceremony we call "The Last Roundup." Afterwards, my mother ended the general membership presentations with a story of the outlaw Younger brothers' time in Texas. As a final speech, author/historian Mike Cox spoke about the history of the Texas Rangers in an address sponsored by the Gunfighters. Gunfighter members give additional financial support to WWHA. After this speech, the general membership disbanded and the Gunfighters attended the annual Gunfighter Luncheon, where attendees voluntarily bring items

or foodstuffs representative of their home state or country. For a closing event that night, we had a banquet featuring a group of re-enactors providing interactive demonstrations of popular Old West table games. After the banquet was finished, the silent auction winners were announced and the live auction began. These auctions contained many classic paintings and first-generation copies of famous photographs from the Bob McCubbin collection. Formal entertainment ended with a Mariachi band, who ended the roundup with a rousing concert. The next WWHA Roundup will take place in Fort Smith, Arkansas.
