A memorial service date has been set to dedicate the tombstone of Frank Stewart on August 6th, 10:00 a.m., at the Fairmont Cemetery in Raton, New Mexico. As Frank Stewart (alias of John W. Green) was instrumental in the "chase and capture" of Billy the Kid, culminating at Stinking Spring, he is due, these 143 years later, recognition with a "first time" tombstone on his previously unmarked grave.


August Premier Bedford, TX Lot 89 The annual Tombstone Territory Rendezvous will be held October 23 - 27 in the
