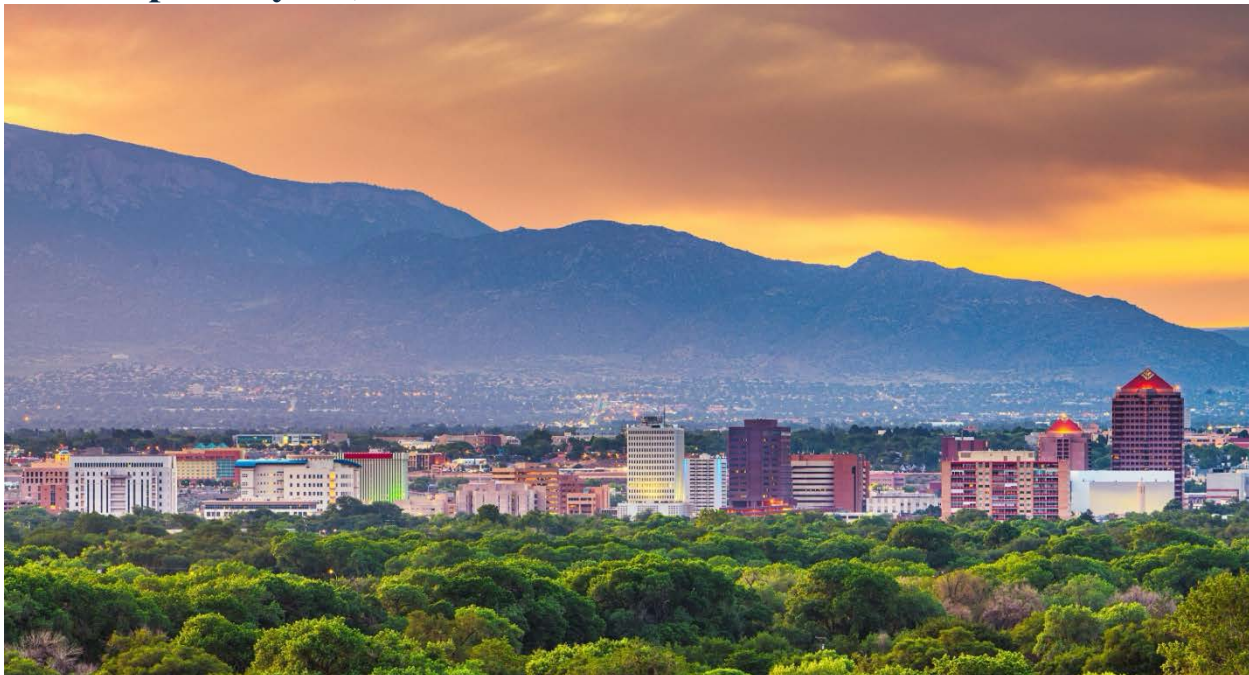

The next Wild West History Association Annual Roundup will be held July 15-18, 2026 hosted by Albuquerque, New Mexico founded in 1706. New Mexico is the home to our largest roundup and next year will be held during the Centennial of Route 66. Nearby Albuquerque Sunport is a five- mile taxi ride to the Roundup headquarters held at The Crown Plaza Hotel at 1901 University Blvd NE Albuquerque, NM 87102 [Hotel in Albuquerque, NM | Albuquerque Hotel | Crowne Plaza](#) . City of Albuquerque Bus transportation will pick you up too and take you to the Alvarado Station Downtown. The Crown Plaza Hotel is a non- smoking resort with outdoor pool and bar located conveniently at the crossroads of Interstate 40 east/west and Interstate 25 north to Santa Fe. We're anticipating an opening Wednesday event at the Albuquerque History Museum and a guided field trip to Santa Fe. For those traveling west a self- guided automobile, Billy the Kid Trail Tour, from Las Vegas, New Mexico along the Pecos River with stops in Romeroville, Anton Chico, Santa Rosa, Puerto de Luna and Fort Sumner. For those traveling east a self-guided automobile, Elfego Baca Trail Tour, from Reserve, New Mexico with stops in Magdalena, Socorro and Albuquerque. For those traveling South The Taos, New Mexico The Kit Carson House and Museum <https://www.kitcarsonhouse.org/> will host an open house and meet the man himself at Kit Carson Park at his resting place.

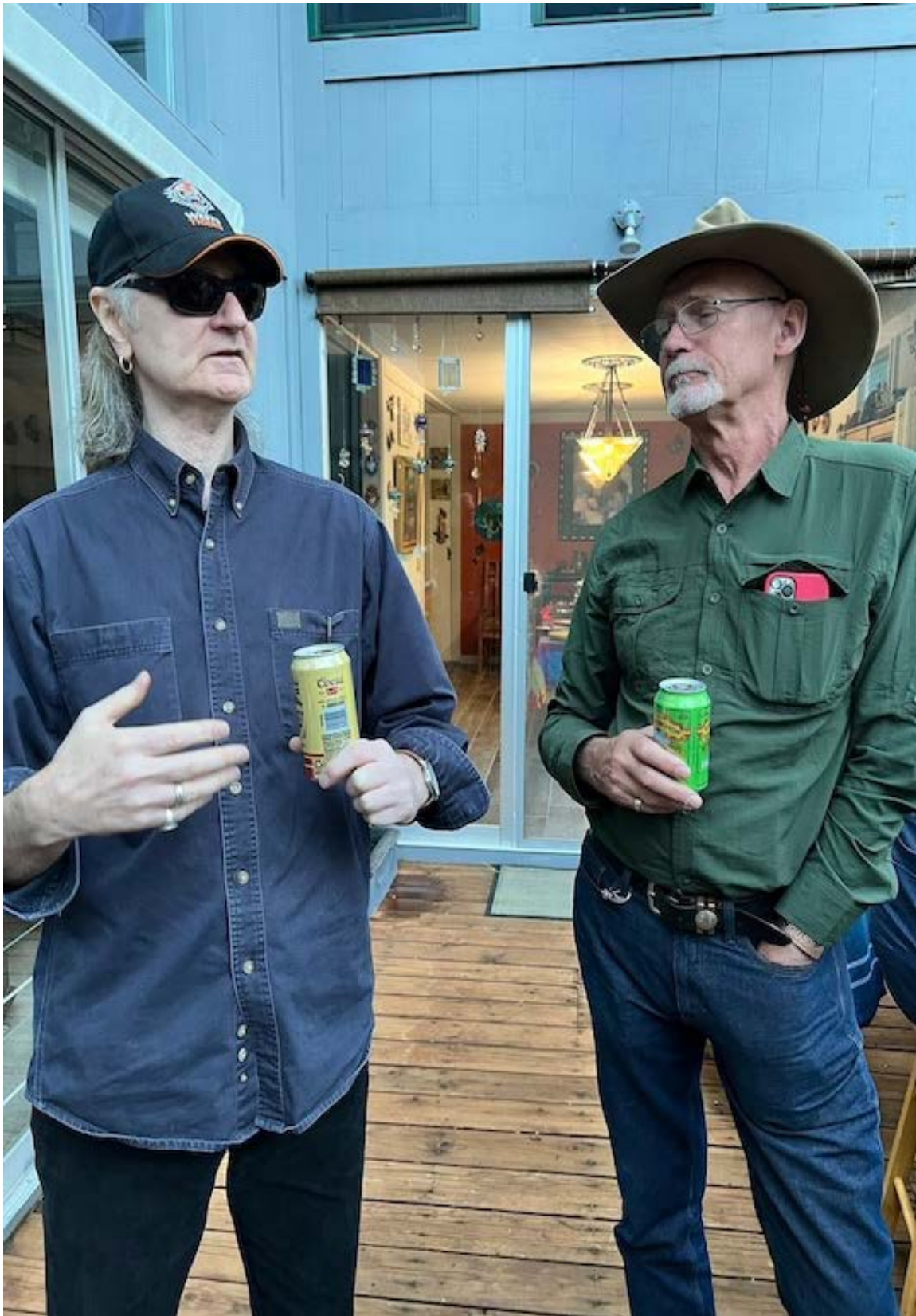

WHEREAS, Reno, Nevada is proud to honor and support the WWHA's efforts to preserve and celebrate our western heritage.





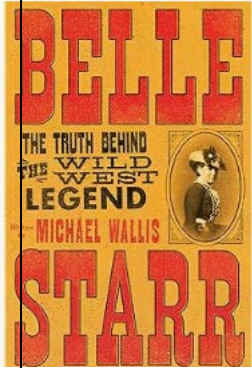
